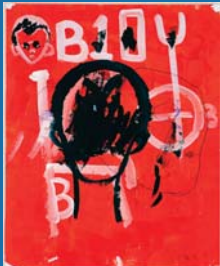

# “Don’t leave me out”

The “Don’t leave me out” Resource Pack has been produced by the Social Inclusion Partnership South East (SIPSE) and explores issues relating to ‘Exclusion through Disability – a focus on children and young people’.

## The pack:

- looks at the barriers and issues faced by disabled children, young people and their families, and has at its heart their genuine views
- uses the principles of the ‘social model’ of disability
- aims to stimulate action by strategic planners and decision makers by:
  - raising awareness
  - encouraging self-evaluation
  - prompting positive change to policies, plans and service delivery.

A range of key issues is identified, concerning the needs of children, young people and their families who are facing disability, with recommendations for ways in which services can meet their needs more effectively.

The pack contains a main report, case studies, useful tools and examples of good practice. It includes a CD Rom containing a PowerPoint presentation of the materials as well as the main report in pdf format. The PowerPoint presentation includes video clips from interviews with disabled young people and their parents, drawing on their experiences of exclusion.
